KAJANG, Wed.—Detainees from Jenderam, who are now either at the Kluang detention camp or at the resettlement camp, Setapak, have received 15 bags of rice from the Ulu Langat UMNO and other Malays, while Malays from Cheras have given 60 pieces of clothing.

The men at Setapak got five bags of rice through the State Welfare Officer, Selangor and the Kluang detainees got their share of ten bags through the penghulu of Kluang.
