GURU LIBEL CASE.

Judgment Given for the Defendants.

(From Our Own Correspondent.)

Kuala Lumpur, October 1.

At the Supreme Court this morning the Chief Justice gave judgment in the famous Guru libel case in which Haji Jalaluddin bin Ismail (a religious teacher of Jendram, Ulu Langat) sued seven other Malays for publishing an alleged libel against him, claiming \$3,200 damages, and prayed for an injunction restraining the defendants from publishing similar libellous statements.

His Lordship (Mr. Justice Gomperty) in the course of a lengthy judgment found for the defendants. The question of costs is to be argued in chambers to-morrow.
