The 2½ hour meeting elected Mr. T.P.S. Krishnasamy as the new President, Mr. S. Alagamuthu as vice-president, Mr. A. Balakrishna as secretary and Mr. Omprakash as treasurer, besides 14 members of the committee. The President and vice-president were elected as their delegates to the Malayan Indian Congress conference.

For Charbai, a Dyak from Borneo, a fire-engine driver in Kuala Lumpur for over 26 years, the clanging of bells and the hurly-burly life of a firefighter is no more. Beloved of his colleagues, and trusted by his superiors, he passed away at the General Hospital, Kuala Lumpur, on Monday, as a result of cerebral haemorrhage. On Tuesday, his coffin, carried in the fire-engine he had driven during his lifetime, was lowered into the grave at the Circular Road Cemetery. A guard of honour was provided by firemen who paid their last homage to their departed comrade.

There was no objection to Malays attending school during the Ramdzan (fasting month) as far as religion is concerned. This was revealed by Dato Menteri Besar Nik Ahmad Kami, presiding at a meeting of the Kelantan Council of State, in reply to

query regarding the opening throughout the Ramdzai of the Ismail English School. Before the war, the Dato Menteri Besar said, when Kelantan was independent they could close the school during the Puasa, but now that the state was part of the Federation of Malaya, it was a matter of policy that all English Schools in the Federation should have the same holidays.
