Jendaram: 945 Still To Be Dealt With

KUALA LUMPUR, Thurs. — Nine hundred and forty-five of the 1,725 persons evicted from Jendaram on Feb. 15 have yet to be dealt with. They are 461 Malays and 484 Chinese.

On the first day, 189 persons were released because they were visitors, non-residents, the families of security forces' personnel or government servants.

Since then, nine others have been released for the same reasons.

Specific evidence of complicity in Communist activity has been established, definitely, against 101 persons—72 Malays and 29 Chinese.

Four hundred and sixty of the persons evicted are relatives of those detained.

A communique issued this morning states that 17 persons can possibly be released in the near future after further inquiries, while there is sufficient evidence to justify court proceedings against four.

Ninety-seven persons are over 60 years of age and 565 under 12 years.
