JENDERAM DETAINEES POLICE TO ACT SOON

KUALA LUMPUR, Wed.—Of the total number of persons detained at Jenderam recently, 217 Chinese and 158 Malays and Indonesians are to be further interrogated as there is evidence against them of complicity in Communist activity.

Replying to Mr. Leung Cheung Ling's question with regard to the present position of these detainees, in the Federal Legislative Council, today, Government stated that it is probable that the Police will apply for individual orders of detention under the Emergency Regulations against most or all of these 375 persons.

Plans are now being made to arrange for their dependants, who number 862, to be accommodated with friends or relatives who are not detained.

It was further stated that the results of the preliminary interrogations will make it possible for nearly 300 other persons to be released in the near future, and that further interrogations, which are necessary, will be carried out as expeditiously as possible.
