I-Card Robbery Charge Fails

KUALA LUMPUR, Thurs.—Remarking that this was the first case in his experience in which the defence of duress stood on solid ground, Mr. Justice E.N. Taylor yesterday bound over a Malay, Yusof bin Maideen, in the sum of \$200 to be of good behaviour for two years.

The accused, who was charged with robbing a Malay woman, Maimunah binte Haji Mahmud, and her son, Zainan, of their identity cards, at Jenderam Hillar on Jan. 15, was acquitted and discharged, but the Judge ordered the accused to enter into a bond.
