BID TO GET MALAY WOMEN RELEASED

The Malay Detainees Welfare Committee of the Federation has undertaken to find sureties for the release of some Malay women detainees, mainly from Jenderam, now in the Kluang detention camp.

These detainees have been unable to find sureties for their immediate release on bond.

This step was taken as a result of a visit yesterday by Tengku Abdul Rahman, UMNO President who is also president of the committee and Inche Abdul Aziz Ishak, the Secretary.

This is the first visit made by the officials of the newly-formed committee, and Tengku Abdul Rahman and Inche Abdul Aziz spent a few hours talking to the Malay detainees.

The committee hopes to distribute clothing and foodstuffs for Hari Raya Haji to the detainees to help clothe the many scantily-clad children in the camp.
