SELANGOR A.C. TRIAL.

Sixteen Hours Test Over 341 Mile Course.

(From Our Own Correspondent.)

Kuala Lumpur, June 11.

The second long distance trial organised by the Selangor Automobile Association proved a great success. Though from the point of view of entries the trial was

below the previous one, in standard it was very much better.

The course was 341 miles long, and took about 16 hours to cover—a hard test for both rider and machine. There were 43 entries, including 14 motor-cyclists.

The route led from Kuala Lumpur, through Puchong, Banting, Sepang, Jendram, Port Dickson, Pengkalen Kempas, Rantau, Seremban, Jelebu Pass, Kuala Klawang, Pertang, Durian Tipis, Karak, Bentong, Tranum, Kuala Kubu, Serendah, Rawang, and then to Kuala Lumpur. This route includes many difficult stretches of road, some of which were in a poor state of repair. Everything considered the competitors stood the severe test well, and few failed to finish the course.
