ASLEEP IN THE MOONLIGHT

KUALA LUMPUR, Tuesday.

SECURITY forces had another big success against the Kajang gang in Selangor when in the early hours of this morning they made a moonlight raid on a unit of the gang and killed three of them.

ROYAL MARINES FLY TO S'PORE

MORE than a dozen officers and men of the Royal Marines, in jungle green battle order, arrived at Kallang Airport, Singapore yesterday afternoon by BOAC Argonaut from Hong Kong.

They were the advance party of the 3rd Royal Marine Commando Brigade, which is being moved to Malaya to fight the bandits. The Marines carried rifles and Sten guns.

A military spokesman last night said that the date of arrival in Singapore of the rest of the Brigade had not been disclosed.

10,000 LOSE HOMES

A Malay bandit was caught by police in the Mentakab area of Pahang yesterday.

In the Sepang area of Negri Sembilan, police arrested six people in a shop known to have been used as a bandit supply

Sixteen squatters living near the camp were arrested and fourteen identified bandit agents were rounded up in nearby Jenderam village.

The action took place on Brookside Estate, near the Semenyih to Dengkil Road.

Acting on information, number 10 platoon of "D" company First Suffolks, and a police jungle squad under the OCPD, Kajang, encircled an area of thick blukar.

The Suffolk patrol, under Lieutenant G. Charrington, moved in and, according to the officer, "practically trod on four sleeping people who were in a rough and temporary shelter."

The four jumped up and ran, but the Suffolks killed two of them and a third ran into the guns of the police and was killed. Only one got away.

One of the dead was a woman.

Two Japanese pistols, one shotgun, one Japanese hand-grenade and four packs of equipment were captured.

Sawmill Murder

An Indian workman was murdered by bandits who robbed labourers at No. 3 Lee Sawmill in the Kota Tinggi area of Johore yesterday.

In the Batu Gajah area last night an unknown number of bandits went to the 26th mile, Tanjong Tualang-Changkat tin road and murdered a Chinese.

The bandits first collected identity cards from the inhabitants of the village, then called out their victim, whose hands were tied behind him before he was shot dead.

In the early hours of yesterday bandits clad in jungle green took more than 400 identity cards from labourers and squatters in the Tapah area.
