Security Men Kill 6 More Bandits

KUALA LUMPUR, Wednesday.

SIX more bandits have been killed and another four wounded, the Federation police reported tonight. Two of the bandits were killed in the Kuala Kubu area of Selangor this morning.

RIOT SQUADS TO PRACTISE

INTERNAL security exercises involving the military and Police will take place in Singapore on two days next week.

During the exercises Police riot squads and military parties will operate in the streets. Sirens will not be used.

On Monday, Jan. 29, there will be Police exercises from 8 a.m. to noon. On Thursday, Feb. 1, military and Police exercises will be held during the same period.

FINED \$1,500

Pleading guilty to assisting in the management of a chap ji ki lottery, Lim Chin Soon, was fined \$1,500 in the Singapore Fourth Police Court yesterday or two months' imprisonment.

A security forces patrol was moving through the jungle when they heard the sound of voices coming from a hut. They hurled a hand grenade inside.

Bandits fled in all directions, but left a Chinese and Malay dead.

Two more bandits were killed on an estate in the Alor Gajah area of Malacca this morning. One armed person was arrested.

While carrying out screening operations on an estate in the Bahau district of Negri Sembilan yesterday, security forces shot dead one bandit and wounded another.

There is no official information about the sixth dead bandit.

Of the two Malay bandits killed recently in the Kajang district of Selangor one has been identified as Abdul Manan Pakeh who was in charge of the Malay "Min Yuen" element in the Jenderam Bukit Raya area.
