KUALA LUMPUR, Mon.
THE empty shell of Jenderam, the Selangor village which became a bandit lair, will go in flames in about five weeks. Until then it is to be stripped of everything useful and saleable.

Anything that can be sold will be auctioned and the money divided among its 1,500 inhabitants.

The livestock from the village, brought to Kuala Lumpur at the end of last week, was sold at the week-end.

Today the Queen's Cinema, Kajang, not in use for two years, was converted into an elaborate provision market.

Tin provisions, Chinese sauce, peas and beans, mee-hoon and coconut oil, which had been brought down to Kajang from Jenderam, were auctioned.
