JENDERAM SCREENING

The United Malays National Organisation has asked the Federation Government to allow their representatives to be present, should the authorities decide to screen the evacuated Jenderam villagers.

The inhabitants of Jenderam, south Selangor, mostly Malays, were evacuated to Kluang, Johore, two weeks ago, as a collective punishment, for aiding the bandits. The village is to be destroyed soon.

The Batu Pahat and Kluang district branch of UMNO has already taken steps to provide material relief for the evacuees, UMNO headquarters announced yesterday.

Relief in the form of clothing, mats, prayer-garbs for women and gifts for children has already been sent to the evacuees.

A relief fund has been established and the UMNO headquarters are also taking steps to aid the evacuees.
