## 101 FROM JENDERAM GUILTY

KUALA LUMPUR, Thurs.  
OF 1,725 Jenderam villagers detained when that whole south Selangor settlement was taken into custody, 101 have now been proved to have engaged in Communist activity.

Seventy-two of them were Malays and 29 Chinese.

A Selangor Government statement says that there is sufficient evidence to justify Court proceedings against four Malays.

### Released

The day that 952 Malays, 670 Chinese, and 103 Indians were moved from the village, 62 were released when found to be visitors or families of constables or special constables.

Since then people released have included Government servants, relatives of police, and non-residents of Jenderam.

Relatives of the 101 people linked with Communist activities number 315 Malays and 145 Chinese.

Only about half of the people detained have been dealt with. There still remains another 461 Malays and 484 Chinese to be classified.

Of those taken to detention camp, 565 were children under 12 years of age, and 97 were more than 60 years old.
