# Soldier dies in 50-bandit fight

KUALA LUMPUR, Saturday.  
**FOUR** bandits were killed, including a known member of the Jenderam Min Yuen, when 50 bandits clashed yesterday in three engagements with security forces in the Kajang District.  
One British soldier was fatally wounded and three

others were wounded.  
A suspect was wounded and arrested while two other bandits escaped, one of whom is believed to have been wounded. In the third engagement one bandit is believed to have been killed and two others wounded.

The dead bandit was identified as Ong Ah Sang, a member of the Jenderam Min Yuen. He had a hand grenade and \$1,000 on his body.

Two more bandits were shot and killed when security forces engaged a bandit gang in the Kampar area of Perak yesterday. A tommy-gun, rifle, and hand grenade and some ammunition were recovered from the bodies.

### Arms found

Another bandit was shot and killed and one was wounded when a security force patrol engaged three bandits in the Bentong area of Pahang today. One Sten gun, hand grenade, two packs and 157 rounds of ammunition were recovered.

In the Muar area of Johore yesterday, two bandits were seen to have been hit and fall when security forces engaged a gang of thirty armed bandits.

Yesterday in the Grik area of Perak, six Chinese bandits armed with shot guns and rifles fired at a Malay auxiliary policeman. He was out with his wife and child. The A.P. returned the fire with his shotgun and the bandits withdrew. The wife and the child were
