KUALA LUMPUR, Tues. — The Malay Detainees' Welfare Committee, which has its headquarters in Kuala Lumpur, has agreed to put up surety for the release of some Malay women, formerly of Jenderam who are now held in Kluang detention camp. These women could not find people to stand surety for them for their release on bond. Tengku Abdul Rahman, president of the Detainees' Welfare Committee, accompanied by Inche Abdul Aziz bin Ishak, the secretary, visited the camp recently. It was the first visit by members of the committee to a detention camp. Both of them will soon visit the Majedie detention camp in Johore Bahru.
