ANTS: A CIVIL WAR

A 2-day battle and a Red Cross too

KUALA LUMPUR, Thursday.

THOUSANDS of large black ants last week fought a life-and-death battle at Jenderam Hilir, a kampong ten miles from Kajang, on the road to Seremban.

An eye-witness Shamsuddin said today that when the battle was at its height two to three square yards of ground was black with "elephant ants."

The fighting, which went on for two days was unusual, he said, because the ants were of the same species.

Thousands of combat ants had their heads bitten off. The dead were buried by fellow warriors.

People from nearby kampongs, who came to watch the battle, said it as an "omen." But just what it signified they were not sure.
