GOODWILL AND RACIAL HARMONY TEAM GO OUT TO THE KAMPONGS

KUALA LUMPUR, Saturday.

HUNDREDS of Alliance election workers are touring kampongs in all parts of the Federation bearing with them their party's message of "goodwill and harmony among the various races."

The Alliance executive secretary, Mr. T. H. Tan, told the Sunday Times today that besides these paid and trained workers, several thousands of the party's volunteers would visit the people in their homes.

correct this falsehood." Tengku Abdul Rahman, Mr. Tan said, would personally lead his party's campaigns against the Pan-Malayan Islamic Party and Party Negara in the East Coast States. The Tengku would fly to Trengganu on Monday. He would spend five days in that State and Kelantan. Mr. Tan added that the Tengku would see to it that there was no mistake this time about the lack of ground work and that the party's machinery and organisation were perfect. After five days in the East Coast, the Tengku will visit Penang. He is tentatively expected to start his campaign in Selangor on July 26. He will start in Sabak Bernam and from there he will visit Tanjong Karang, Kuala Selangor, Jenderam and Klang.

No worry

Commenting on the resignations from the M.C.A., Mr. Tan said that they had hardly any effect on the election machinery and prospects. "Nor is money our worry, but we would welcome more donations from our well-wishers," he added.

Meanwhile, the Alliance candidates in Selangor have already begun intensive campaigning. The UMNO Publicity Chief in Selangor, Inche Dahari Ali, also an Alliance candidate in Kuala Selangor constituency, said that they were persently devoting more time to house-to-house and mukim-to-mukim canvassing. "Later on, giant rallies will be held as the tempo of the electioneering rises," he added.
